We all have relational needs

- <u>The Great Commandment</u>..."Jesus replied, "You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments."" Matthew 22:37-40 NLT
- <u>The New Commandment</u>..."So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other. Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples."" John 13:34-35 NLT.
- We do not have the ability or resource to meet our own needs.
- "And this same God who takes care of me will supply all your needs from his glorious riches, which have been given to us in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:19 NLT
- We are all motivated by needs
- Jesus always met a relational need before He met a Spiritual need.
- Meeting relational needs means removing aloneness...
- "Then the Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper who is just right for him."" **Genesis 2:18 NLT**
- God designed us with relational needs.

- Often what we deal with in our homes and in our church is the result of aloneness.
- Married people: your spouse is to be the primary remover of aloneness.
- When our basic relational needs are met we experience intimacy. When our needs are unmet we experience hurt and loss.
- Our God is a need meeting God!
